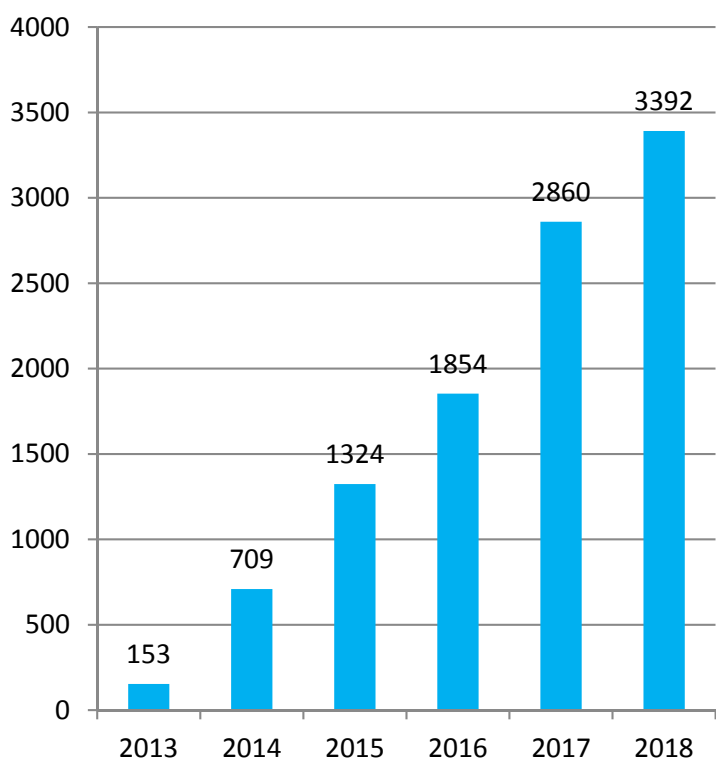

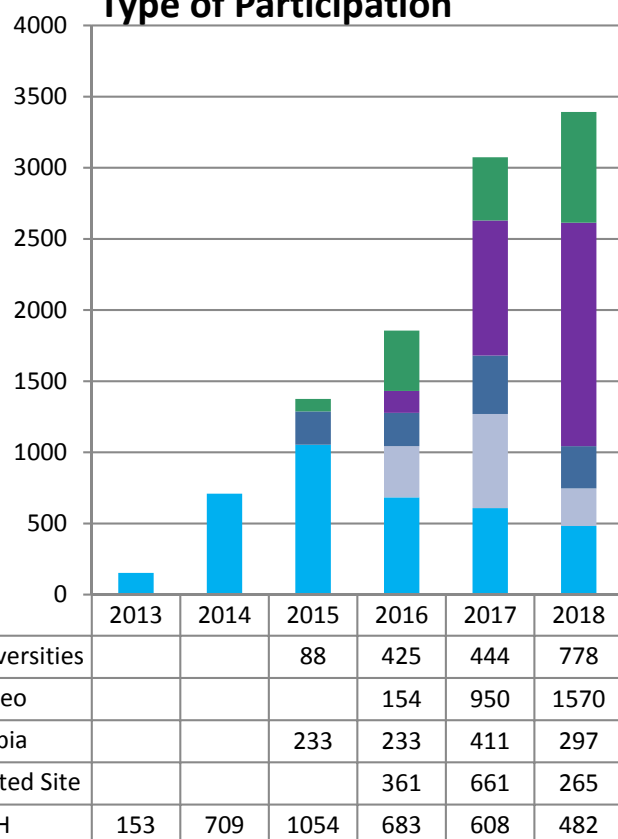

The 2018 Research Skills Seminar Series has currently delivered 15 seminars.

Type of Participation

As hoped, numbers have increased from Hosted Video-Conference and Online Scopia participants as the demand for options to view the seminar externally has increased.

University collaboration has occurred with UWA Clinical Students since 2017 including embedding in community modules, University of Notre Dame since 2017, and ECU Clinical Students since 2018.

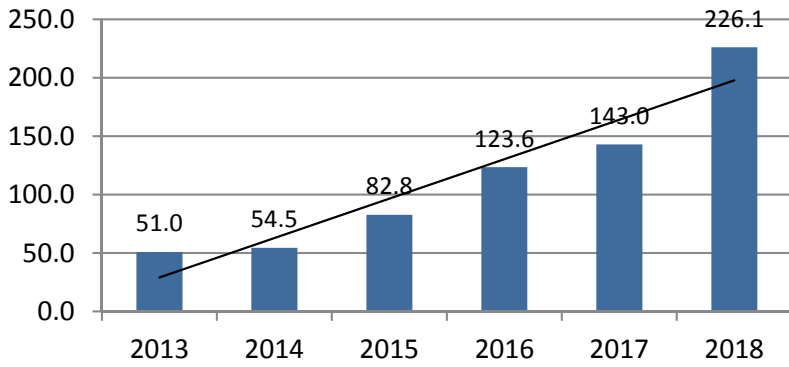
Additional Activity

An additional 200+ participants (*not included in graph*) have attended supplementary Good Clinical Practice workshops and forums that have been hosted by the Research Education Program since 2014. The Research Education Program has also delivered ad-hoc seminars for UWA Winter School Training, DGP, and RPH ABC of Research which are not included in the graph.

Evaluation

Each seminar receives feedback from attendees which is calculated into ratings. Over 5 years, seminars consistently average 4.4 out of 5.

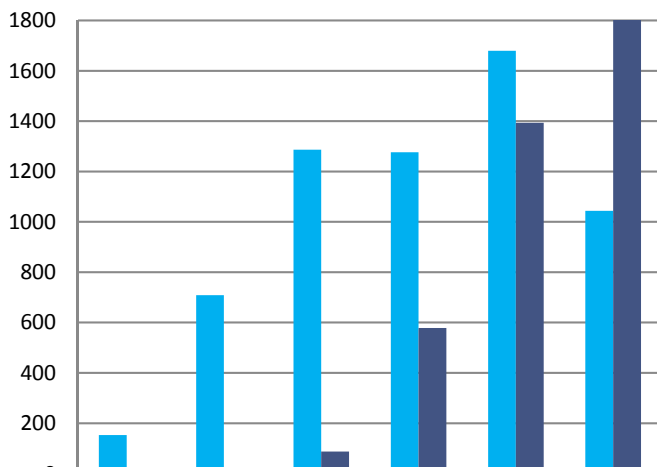
Average Number of Participants
